ENCOURAGEMENT: Putting God First

How do you manage in your life – and that of your family ... with work and church commitments?

There are just so many different demands and distractions that call for our attention – our jobs, our kids, our family, our sport, our hobbies, etc., that we need to be careful not to let them become more important, or more of a priority than our God. After all, we know we should worship God – not idols.

Surely, for Christians, there's only one perfect answer ... with God's help ... by putting God first!

In Matthew 6:33 we are reminded of the importance of seeking God's kingdom and righteousness as our main priority, above all else. We need to remain focused upon our relationship with God.

Do you often find yourself in an interesting, and sometimes confusing, predicament where you're having difficulty trying to work out how you can do all the things you want, or would like, to do? There's the important contracts at work that need to be worked on NOW – not later, there's the special awards night or concert at your child's school and you really have to be there, there's the family birthday celebration, the grandchild's grand final soccer match, the restaurant dinner with your spouse that you've already booked ... not forgetting the Bible Study or Prayer Meeting at church!!!

Life in our world can get VERY busy and getting to spend time with God (in a morning devotion, praying or reading God's Word) can so easily 'get in the road', and may be overlooked. Perhaps we try to rationalise our final decision about how we fit everything in by convincing ourselves that by working long hours we have more opportunities to help other people?

In Proverbs 3:6, we read: "In everything you do, put God first, and he will direct you and crown your efforts with success."

I came across this transcript on the internet - a talk by Denzel Washington to new grads ... about 10 years ago – and found it interesting, in terms of our encouragement theme:

Put God first in everything you do ... Everything that I have is by the grace of God, understand that. It's a gift ... I didn't always stick with him, but He stuck with me ... While you're [on your knees], say thank you. Thank you for grace, thank you for mercy, thank you for understanding, thank you for wisdom, thank you for parents, thank you for love, thank you for kindness, thank you for humility, thank you for peace, thank you for prosperity. Say thank you in advance for what is already yours ... True desire in the heart for anything good is God's proof to you, sent beforehand that it's already yours ... When you get it, reach back, pull someone else up.

Sometimes it's easy to overlook the 24/7 *direct connection* we have with God – our God who is always available, always ready to listen and answer our prayers ... our God who is unchanging, always the same – yesterday, today and forever, a God who doesn't ever need to change, a God who is PERFECT, a God in whom we can have *complete* trust and faith, a God who tells us: "I am the way, the truth and the life." [John 14:6]

With the many different things happening in our lives, in our family and around the world, it is not surprising that we can, at times, feel unwell, miserable or tired – even to the point of doubting God's love for us and the way he cares for us.

Do personal, everyday issues and family problems ever get you down?

Do you ever feel distressed and depressed about what's happening in your life?

Do you ever feel like everything in your world is falling apart and getting you down?

Do you ever feel despondent and overwhelmed by what is happening in our world?

Do you ever feel ignored, or neglected, or bullied by what others say to you at work, or school?

I'm sure that we can all relate to these experiences/situations at some time or other. What can we do? When we find ourselves in these and similar situations, we really do need to do something about life's priorities ... and put God first, talk to God, lean on him ... and ask for his help. We need to PRAY!

That's how we put God first.

That's how we cope with living in our busy world.

That's how we manage when faced with daily challenges or problems.

That's how we find peace – through the grace of God.
